The 18 year-old driver was impaired by alcohol and marijuana. Niko was badly burned with little chance to survive. His family says Niko was a warrior, fighting to survive for 508 days with strength, will and perseverance. Niko succumbed to the inju-

Niko enjoyed spending time with his family and friends, playing sports and video games, camping, listening to music and eating Fruit Loops for breakfast, lunch and dinner. He was a loyal Dallas Cowboys fan. His smile would light up any room, and it was never quiet when Niko was around.

Niko is the son of Michael and Alicia M. DiNovo, brother to Michael, Bella and Nino, grandson of James and Donna DiNovo and the late Gladys Hartigan, David and Alice Ryder. Niko has many aunts, uncles, cousins and friends who love him dearly.
